#### HEALTH AWARENESS FOR NOVEMBER November is National Diabetes Month

Diabetic eye disease, a leading cause of blindness, often has no early warning signs. That's why it's so important for people with diabetes to get regular eye exams to catch problems early — and get timely treatment and the right follow-up care.

More than 30 million people living in the United States have diabetes. Having diabetes increases the risk for vision loss and blindness from diabetic eye diseases. Teal is the Alzheimer's Awareness color of the Alzheimer's Foundation of America (AFA). AFA uses teal because it has been shown in color psychology studies to be a calming color.
