
Congratulations to Sister Annette Fletcher, who was inducted into the University of Alabama - Huntsville (UAH) Athletics Hall of Fame on September 23, 2023.

Annette's Career Highlights:

-Member of the UAH Women's Basketball program from 1982-87

-Ended her career as the program's all-time leading scorer with 1,487 points and remained atop the record books until 2014

-Ranks in the top five in program history in her career with points (1,487), points per game (16.2), field goals made (662), field goal percentage (.538), and steals (240)



-In her 1986-87 season, set and still holds the program records for points (655), points per game (24.3), field goals made (299) and steals (84)

Walking, Even a Little, may Extend your Life. Fall is the perfect time of year to begin a walking routine. Why fall? Because any time of year is the perfect time to get walking! Whatever you do, don't let high expectations stop you from lacing up your sneakers and heading out the door. You don't need to become an Olympic racewalker to reap the benefits of walking. In fact, while 150 minutes a week of exercise is recommended for good health and disease prevention, research on older adults shows that walking for less time than that can help give you more years in your life to get in those steps! Like all habits, being sedentary gets ingrained in the mind and the body. But so, too, does being more active. After all it feels really good! You don't need a gym membership, fancy workout clothes, or pricey running shoes to start walking - just a pair of comfortable sneakers and clothes you can move in. Start with a 20-minute walk at a brisk pace, or even a 5-minute walk at an easy pace if that's

enough for you at first. You know yourself best. And if you already have a walking routine underway, kick things up a notch by extending your walks, walking a little faster, or adding in some hills. Just be sure not to increase by more than 10 percent over your previous week's average any week - doing too much too fast is the recipe for injury. That said, the more you walk, the greater the health benefits – and, most likely, the longer and healthier your life.

Union Chapel M.B. Church Girl Scout Troops held their annual Bridging Ceremony on Saturday, September 23, 2023 in the Charles L. Ray, Jr. Family Life Center Gymnasium. The bridging process acknowledges girls who have completed one level of Girl Scouting and are moving up to the next level. Union Chapel has a total of fifty plus girls registered in all levels of Scouting from Daisies to Ambassadors with 14 registered leaders assisting these young ladies with earning badges as well as High Honor Awards.

Troop leaders recognized 27 girls bridging to the next level of Scouting:

Each Girl Scout level builds off of the previous level, enhancing their leadership skills as well as allowing each girl to expand their knowledge of previous badges earned and the opportunity to earn additional badges as well as earn high honor awards. Our girls are often given opportunities to hold various positions as well as serve as an MC or host of a Girl Scout event as we have one Girl Board Member within our Troops.

Union Chapel also had two girls' complete requirements to earn High Honor Awards:

Bridging Cadette Ayana Hughes earned the Silver Award. The Silver Award is earned as a Cadette Girl Scout completing two required Journeys and research hours proving the sustainability of their project. Ayana's project was entitled "Dance for Joy Day" as she taught various breathing techniques while teaching a cheer dance to help build their endurance.

Graduating Ambassador Olyvia English earned the Gold Award. Girl Scouts can start working toward requirements to obtain their Gold Award upon entering the Senior Troop as this is the highest honor a Girl Scout can receive. Requirements include completing two Journeys unless you earned your Silver Award and then they only have to complete one additional Journey. They must then complete a take action project which is Community Service based and submit application to the GSNCA board to be interviewed and given approval to continue their project. Upon approval they must complete 80 hours' working on their project. Olyvia took on a massive project completing 80 plus hours beautifying the exterior of Union Chapel MB Church's Food & Clothing Pantry located at 100 Orange Drive. Olyvia completed (2) Journeys and upon receiving approval to begin her project she began gathering her fellow Troop members and scheduling clean-up days at the Orange Drive location. Her project included potting plants, pressure washing, raking and bagging leaves as well as constructing (3) benches to be utilized by Pantry volunteers and Pantry guests. Olyvia wanted those utilizing the Pantry services to have a pleasant experience upon entering the facility.

The Silver and Gold are two of three awards recognized as High Honor Awards that a girl can earn as a Girl Scout. The third being the Bronze Award which is earned as a Junior Girl Scout.
